

## **SEERA U11 HADP Program Information Sheet**

This document contains information on the SEERA U11 Hockey Alberta Development Program (“HADP”) for the 2024/2025 season.

Note the information herein may be subject to change.

### **Who is SEERA?**

SEERA is the governing body for all minor hockey for South East Edmonton. It is made up of two feeder organizations, Millwoods Hockey Association (“MWH”) and North Seera Hockey Association (“NSHA”).

For the U11 HADP level, select players from MWH and NSHA merge to form one team under SEERA. This is done to ensure we field the strongest possible team for the U11 HADP program.

### **What is the U11 HADP program?**

U11 HADP is the name of the top level of hockey at the U11 level under Hockey Alberta.

### **Why was the U11 HADP program created?**

The program was created to provide opportunities for players to access the top level of hockey in Alberta, within a reasonable distance from their residence and provide players with a developmental system that focuses on skill development and acts as a feeder system for U13 Club hockey.

### **What does the U11 HADP Program offer?**

The HADP program offers similar demands and expectations as Club Hockey programs and offers development geared towards a successful transition into club hockey in the future.

Under this program, your child will play on a team that offers high quality coaching, a competitive team atmosphere, additional development from third party organizations (generally 1h skills session per week), additional ice times (practices and tournaments) and longer game slots (1 1/4h).

In general, parents can expect their child to have a hockey related activity 4-6 times per week, though this may vary per coaches discretion (and in consultation with parents).

### **Head Coach Selection**

The Head Coach for the U11 SEERA HADP team is Jason Magee.

### **Evaluations**

There is a \$100 cost for players to evaluate for the SEERA U11 HADP team.

Evaluations for the SEERA U11 HADP team are open to the following players:

- 2014 born players who played U11 HADP, Tier 1 or Tier 2 for the 2023/2024 season;
- 2015 born players who played for MW301, NS301 or Tier 1 for another organization during the 2023/2024 season;
- 2014 and 2015 born players who played HSL Major (or underage) for the 2023/2024 season; or,
- with permission from the SEERA U11/U13 Director(s).

Players are not automatically registered for SEERA U11 HADP evaluations. They must “opt in” by registering with SEERA on or before August 15th. Players are required to first register with their usual feeder organization (MWHHA or NSHA). A link to the SEERA U11 HADP sign up page will be made available April 24th.

Players must specify which position(s) they wish to evaluate for. For players that list multiple positions, they will be told which position for which they made the team and will be expected to play that position for the remainder of the season.

Evaluations will be completed by a third-party company, in coordination with the SEERA U11 HADP coaching staff and Directors.

There is no minimum number of players that must be selected from either feeder organizations.

Evaluations are expected to start in early September and conclude by the second week of September to allow for players to return to their home organization, should they not make the SEERA U11 HADP team. Players that do not make the SEERA U11 HADP team will automatically return to their feeder organization and into their evaluation process.

Players are permitted to withdraw from the SEERA U11 HADP evaluations at any point prior to the commencement of the second game evaluation.

Due to player insurance reasons, players registered for SEERA U11 HADP evaluations are not permitted to skate in MWHHA or NSHA evaluations until they have been released or withdrawn from the SEERA U11 HADP program.

Further details about the evaluations, including ice times and locations, will be provided later in the summer once registration has closed.

### **Roster Construction**

The Head Coach will have final say over roster construction to account for positional and tactical requirements using the rankings provided by the third party evaluators and in consultation with the Director(s).

### **Camps, Shiny and Pre-Skates**

Players registered for SEERA U11 HADP evaluations are permitted, and encouraged, to participate in the MWHHA and NSHA camps, pre-skates and shiny sessions that take place in advance of the SEERA U11 HADP evaluations. SEERA will not be offering any ice times in advance of evaluations.

### **Fees**

The total base registration amount required to play for the SEERA U11 HADP team is \$725. In addition, there will be added costs, but these will be dependent on several factors such as the number of tournaments to which the team enrolls, the cost of the development sessions, the number of extra ice slots obtained etc.

That said, to give a rough guide up front, families can expect to pay \$725 in base registration and between \$500 and \$1,000 in seed money at the start of the season. Seed money is used to cover the extra development, apparel, tournaments etc.

## **Fundraising and Sponsorship**

Teams may choose to help offset their costs through fundraising events or sponsorships. Money generated from these activities may be used to reduce families seed money deposits only (i.e. you cannot fundraise to cover the base MWAH and NSHA registration fees).

Fundraising is optional for families, however, this is often a great team building exercise and is therefore highly encouraged. That said, any family that does not participate will not be entitled to any funds received from the efforts and will be responsible for contributing to the team any additional funds required (or seed money won't be returned to that family).
